Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 25, 2017

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Jeremiah 20:10-13
Psalm 69:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35
Romans: 5:12-15
Matthew 10:26-33

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to the Twelve:

"Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known. What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna. Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father."

Focus questions:

1. Describe a time when fear caused you to live/act in a certain way.
2. Relate a time when you spoke or acted fearlessly for the truth.
3. Describe a time when you were moved by the truth and overcame your doubts or fears.

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you helped someone who was afraid.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

We become what we eat. Food shapes us not only biologically but also spiritually. Food appeases our hunger. Food, when shared with others, promotes friendship. Biologically, it sustains life in the body. Spiritually, it brings the hosts and the guests together. Food becomes flesh and blood of our body. Eating together becomes the moment of family-love, sharing friendship and peace.

Today is the Feast of Corpus Christi. We celebrate Jesus' sharing His body and blood in the form of food and drink with us. This act of Jesus' sharing is called the Sacrament of the Eucharist which happens at every celebration of the Holy Mass. This happened for the first time at the Last Supper, on that Holy Thursday when Jesus ate with his disciples for the last time before he was betrayed by Judas and crucified on the Cross.

We continue the Last Supper celebration at every mass. As Jesus promised that He would be ever with us until the end of the world, we believe in His presence in this Sacrament. We consume Him as food and drink in the form of bread and wine. We become His presence as He mingles with us nourishing our soul and body in the form of food.

Believing in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharis is essentially Catholic. In every Catholic Church the central focus is the Tabernacle where we repose the Body of Christ in the form of Bread. We genuflect before the Eucharist when we come before it.

In memory of the Golden Jubilee of our faith journey as St. Thomas More parish-family, we would like to reveal this Eucharistic presence by opening the wall in our sanctuary. At the death of Jesus the thick veil dividing the people from God's presence in the Temple was torn and God's Holy of Holies was exposed to people. (Mt. 27:51; Mk 15:38). Our Church still has the wall between the presence and the congregation. Opening the wall will make the Lord's presence visible to all. It would also provide a wider place in the Sanctuary for liturgical celebrations. The construction will start in October. We plan to finish the work of exposing the Tabernacle of the Eucharist with its beautiful stained glass window by Christmas of 2017.

Last Sunday I explained our need for renovation and invited every family to participate in the Capital Campaign. You must have also received a brochure by mail explaining the ways and modes of making your pledge. This week is Commitment Week. I request you to pledge your financial contribution over a four-year period. I thank all those who have already pledged their contribution.

You can learn from the Capital Campaign Thermometer how much we have already made and how much more is needed in order to reach our goal. Thank you for your generosity. May God continue to bless you and lead you to make the right offering, for as St. Paul writes to his believers in Corinth, God loves a cheerful giver (2 Cor. 9:7).

Happy Father's Day: We wish all fathers good health and a long life with a cheerful heart to live and enjoy the love of their family. We thank God for the gift of fatherhood in them. We appreciate all that you are as a father for the family and all that you do selflessly for the family. God bless you abundantly.

We are bringing out a Journal in celebration and commemoration of our Parish Golden Jubilee. We invite you to memorialize yourselves and your family by printing your pictures in them for a minimum price. Frank Bayer who captures all the celebrative moments of the parish has come forward to photograph families. He will be available in Walden Hall after weekend masses during the last weekend of July (29-30) and first two weekends of August (5-6 & 12-13).

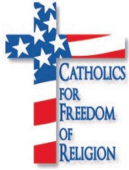

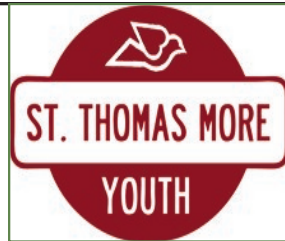
